



To the family of **Sheila Taylor** (pictured here with her late husband **Peter**) [who passed away 10 June 2019, age 71].



[p. 35, comment on Isaiah ch. 45, Book 53-4A]

- **1. Do we hear** the words of the Lord to us?
- 2. Do we, "wait upon the Lord"?
- **3. Is prayer the formal two way process** it is meant to be, or do we rush through our prayer time, with our minds on the daily "to do" list, and the same spirit of busyness drives us along as drives the pagans around us?
- 4. Let us pause, reflect, plan our prayer requests, and at least daily come before the Lord to pause from rush and bustle and make our requests slowly and carefully, and wait for the Lord's peace or challenge before we rise and rush to our next appointment.
- **5. No appointment is as important as** the one with the King of Kings and Lord of all Lords.
- 6. We enter the throne-room of Heaven when we pray, and we enter it too casually, and without the pause and dignity that an ambassador requires when approaching his king to request direction and receive daily orders. Hebrews 4:16, 10:19-22, 12:1-3.
- **7. How hungry** are we daily for spiritual food from the Word of God?
- **8.** How thirsty for the cleansing power of the Holy Spirit as He takes "The Word" and washes us clean from sin, from doubts, and from fears, as we rest upon the promises of God?
- **9.** Audit your days and nights believer. Audit your hours each day Pastor.
- **10. How many hours are spent wasted** with people or activities that have no profit for the Kingdom of Heaven?
- **11. We need** good sleep, **we need** good exercise, **we need** good food, **we need** time spent with spouse and children to strengthen bonds, and these things have legitimate claim upon hours of every day.
- **12. Indeed if we fail to do these things we fall short of** the Lord's demands upon us **to set the right example** to our loved ones, and lay the foundation for our witness to the world.
- 13. Having said these things, what is done with the rest of your time?
- **14.** The image of the mighty green tree by the deep river in times of drought is **the image for the strong believer** in both the **Psalms** and **Isaiah**. It is the image that is to express the reality of our daily life.

- **15.** We only have this reality of stability **when our roots have gone deep into "The Word of God" for year after year**, so that when the drought comes we have the habit of faithful obedience to draw upon.
- **16.** Every day we either build our future stability through **faith-rest**, or we undermine our own future, by inaction or false action.
- **17. Let us walk in the spirit** and so fulfil our destiny as the strong ambassadors for Christ that we are meant to be.
- **18.** Regular audits of **the fruit of the Spirit in our lives** is a vital self help strategy, as **a lack of fruit can give us warning of carnality** that has been slipping into our lives.
- **19.** As the Holy Spirit moves through our lives we have power and focused action in our lives, and we will have joy and service in the Spirit.
- **20.** Let us not let any slackness creep in and rob us of the eternal rewards that are the lot of all who serve him with consistent focus and energy.
- **21. Let us remember daily who we worship.** We worship the Creator, Saviour God; The Lord of all.
- **22.** He is not surprised by any problem we have, nor caught short of power in any circumstance. Let us remember the Lord's gentle sarcasm to Job and Isaiah's people, for we need the reminder of who it is we serve. He is able to keep us! We can cast our cares upon him. **Philippians 4:7, Jude 24.** No details of our life are outside the loving mercy of the Lord God.
- 23. The message regarding idols is clear to us all; we are not to trust our lives to anything that can turn to dust or ashes. If our car rusts, and it does, we are not to spend inordinate amounts of our time worshipping at its shrine, no matter how much it cost, nor how beautiful it is.
- 24. All our lusts and desires may blind us to greater truth. We must be careful of our desires, for they can lead us into dangerous places and meet our hearts lust, but rob us of lasting satisfaction. Let us educate our desires through the tutorship of the Holy Spirit, correcting our lusts through the Word and so build stability in the soul rather than erode it from within.
- **25.** Forgiveness is guaranteed for the believer in Christ Jesus. Forgiveness is guaranteed because it depends upon the mercy and grace of God, not the works of men, **but there are "fruits of repentance"** and they ought to be there in the life of the penitent believer. If we do not take sin seriously we will not "seriously" grow.
- 26. Let us be serious about sin and all the distractions that lead us away from the path of the Lord.
