

## **CAMP RULES**

- 1 The camp kitchen is out of bounds to everyone unless you have been invited to help serve.
- 2 No smoking in any buildings at any time.
- 3 No phones, ipad's, or similar, around the camp unless required as part of the programme or used as a communication or sensory aid. Please ensure mobiles are muted during meetings.
- 4 Camp activities will be run at scheduled times throughout the weekend and will be run by camp staff or trained adults from within our group.
- 5 Some activities (such table tennis, indoor and outdoor games) will be freely available throughout the weekend. Please obey camp rules and supervision expectations.
- 6 Children must be supervised at all times by their parent or caregiver if going off-site to the beach. Parents and caregivers please inform a staff member if you are going off-site and communicate your expected arrival back to camp.
- 8 After lights out, noise around the camp must be kept at a minimum level as people need their sleep.
- 10 Campers and volunteers are expected to follow all additional campsite specific rules.

## **Code of Conduct for all Camp Volunteers & Participants**

- 1 Campers and volunteers are expected to respect and abide by the authority, directions and instructions of the Camp Leaders. Campers and volunteers are to abide by the rules of the Campsite.
- 2 Campers and volunteers are to have the prior consent of the person before assisting or helping that person.
- 3 To ensure the well being and safety of all campers and volunteers the following applies:
  - A Campers and volunteers are not permitted to meet alone in secluded locations or situations.
  - B Campers and volunteers may not be involved in assisting with toileting or ablutions unless they are the family/carers of the individual.
  - C Campers and volunteers may not touch anyone in an inappropriate way or behave in a way that is offensive, abusive or potentially sexual.
- 4 If any camper or volunteer has concerns with the behaviour of another participant, they are to refer that matter of concern to their programme leader. If it is a minor problem, the programme leader is to take appropriate action. Any major behavioural problems must be reported to the Camp Director, who is then responsible for taking appropriate action.
- 5 Campers and volunteers are to respect the confidentiality of any personal information they receive from any other participant, except where the life or safety of a person, or others is at risk; in which case, they will notify the Camp Director.
- 6 Campers and volunteers are not to seek to gain information from another participant who is not willing to share it with them.
- 7 If someone is injured, ensure that one person stays with the injured person whilst another notifies the Camp First Aid Officer.
- 8 All visitors to the camp are required to abide by the Code of Conduct.
- 9 Campers are to value, respect and support all other participants at camp.

Any breach of the above Code of Conduct ultimately becomes the responsibility of the Elevate Christian Disability Trust board.
